Terms and conditions

APPLICABLE TO DOGS & SMALL ANIMALS

- The **minimum age is 18** to be considered for rehoming any animal.
- If you are unable to keep the pet it must be returned to Animal Rescue Centre- Arbroath, you must not sell, pass on or breed from this pet.
- All residents of the home must agree to the adoption of the pet.
IF YOUR HOME IS RENTED: You **MUST** provide written consent from your landlord, housing association or council stating you may keep animals on the premises.
- Proof of address must be provided & you must agree to a home check before any home trial is agreed upon & begins (for Dogs). For small animals, we require pictures and sizes of intended living areas.
- All personal data is kept and processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. I understand that my details will be held on the charity's database and will be treated confidentially under these terms.

APPLICABLE TO DOGS ONLY

- All dogs on home trial **MUST** be kept on the lead unless in an enclosed garden & must be kept at the listed address with the exception of emergency reasons.
In any emergency situation, the ARC must be contacted as urgently as possible to notify of any changes to the address where the dog will be situated and the expected length of time.
- A dog must not be kept outside while the home is empty or when the occupants go to bed at night, regardless of the provisions of a kennel or run.
Dogs must not be tied up anywhere outside alone or left alone overnight.
- Any dog offered for rehoming must be neutered & we will ensure this is done by ourselves before final adoption occurs and usually when still on home trial.
If it is a young dog or female and therefore not possible to do this during the home trial, the ARC may extend the home trial until it is appropriate to neuter the dog before the final adoption takes place.
- During home trial, the animal must be given a reasonable amount of time to settle and adjust to their new life & routine, imagine how it is for us to move house and meet new people, it is a very stressful time for dogs and this can cause some dogs to go backwards on training e.g. some dogs who are house trained may have accidents, please be patient. We also provide an advice sheet about caring for a rescue dog.
- The minimum adoption donation is £300.00 which contributes to the cost of neutering and vaccinations.
- We reserve the right to remove any dog at any time if we feel it's needs are not being properly met.
- The ARC will officially still own all dogs on home trial until final adoption takes place.
